The unfortunate passing of George Floyd in 2020, as well as all the other unresolved killings of innocent black people from wrongful racial profiles, to unhinged police officers pulling the trigger without proper cause, and so many more heartbreaking acts of injustice against black people in America, is what sparked the inspiration of this piece. The eagle symbolizes freedom, but the chains wrapping around it represent the bondage that still exists within the American justice system. The White House is split in half and is a symbol of its fractured state, while the gavel with blood leaking from it symbolizes all the black people who were either killed, or sentenced without proper cause due to the color of their skin.

Questionnaire

1. What are your interests?

As it relates to art, I am interested in all forms of art from digital/physical painting, sculpture, textiles, and more. All forms inspire my own style and artistic craft.

2. Why did you decide to do Visual Arts?

It was actually the over way around. Visual art chose me and it was a gift given to me by God. It was something I discovered I had the ability to use to create whatever my imagination could conjure from a very young age, most likely around 6 or 7 years old. I knew from such a young age that art was what I was meant to do for the rest of my life.

3. When do you create artwork?

I create artwork every day to express my creative mind. I realize how vast of an imagination I have and art helps me to bring my thoughts to reality.

4. What type of art style influences your artworks? (Art Movements/Art Periods)

I am heavily influenced and inspired by the Surrealist movement founded by Andre Breton in the 1920s. The artist around that period who influenced me the most was Salvador Dali amongst other Surrealist artists. They sought to unleash the power of the imagination and create works that were full of unexpected and irrational juxtapositions of objects, dream-like imagery, and other elements that defied logic and reason.

5. What type of artistic techniques or approaches do you take toward your artwork?

My primary approach for every piece I create is to allow the art to flow. I seldom have one direct path I take when creating artwork, and I do not like to be too controlling of what my natural creative mind wants to do. When I try to force the process or the direction, sometimes the end result of the art isn't done well. There are times when I have commissions that have a specific direction given by the client, but otherwise, I allow my creativity to run its course.

My techniques mainly involve photomanipulation or photo composting, lighting application, and digital painting.

6. What materials or tools in painting do you use mostly?

I use Adobe Photoshop to create my art so all the tools I require are the digital assets and tools within the software.

7. What kind of Graphic design or painting tools do you use in art?

I use a plethora of tools within Adobe Photoshop from the pen tool, digital brushes, lighting adjustments, color application tools, and more.

8. What programs do you use to aid you in your creative process?

I use multiple software to create and post artwork to my online audience on platforms such as my website, Instagram, YouTube, Behance, and more. I use Adobe Photoshop (art creation), Davinci Resolve (video editing), and Logic Pro (audio recording/voiceovers).

9. Who are the various Visual artists that have influenced your artworks thus far?

There are many artists who have inspired me so far because I love all forms of art, even non-visual art forms. However, visual artists who have influenced my art specifically are Salvador Dali and most surrealist artists, Noyse Works, Paula Stopka, & Taj Francis.

10. What other avenues influence your artistic concepts? (Politics, Dance, Religion, Music, Love, Death, Family...)

I receive inspiration from all aspects of life and I also like to draw information from literature such as stories, biblical scripture, poetry, music, historical events, and everyday life. Always remember that art reflects life.

11. Which other individuals inspire you?

Others who inspire me are my parents because they sacrificed a great amount for me to reach where I am in my career today. They motivate me every day to be the best artist I can be and I work hard to provide back to them. I am their investment and I will make sure they receive their blessings in full for all the sacrifices they made on my behalf.

My only other inspiration who is greater than them, is Jesus Christ/God. God is literally the ultimate creator, and I see the evidence of this when I see the physical creation of the planet we exist on. What man can create the sky? What man can fill the oceans? What man can place every star in space? What man directs the path in which the wind travels? What man can shake the earth or pierce the sky with lightning? These are just a few questions that reveal how minuscule we are compared to the glory and creative power of God.

12. In what condition, emotional state, and place are you more creative; if there is a certain mood for your source of creativity?

I find that I'm able to create more efficiently when I'm in a peaceful state of mind. Sometimes if I am stressed with work projects or even personal life issues, it can affect my performance and mental health when creating my art.

13. Where have your artworks been presented?

My artwork has been presented in both online and physical public spaces. It's important to be diverse in how and where you choose to present your work so that you can expand your audience as broadly as possible.

14. What are your artistic achievements?

I have various artistic achievements, but the most significant ones are when I first discovered the type and style of art I wanted to specialize in, as well as my first television interview on CVM TV Jamaica.

15. Which Visual artist(s), business or person have you networked with? (within the art society or outside of the artistic society?

It would be quite difficult to name them all because I've networked and worked with a range of entities from persons who wanted art commissions, to partnering with businesses, and more. The truth is that there are many avenues in which you can find those who can connect you to your next project or opportunity, both inside and outside the artistic society. It could be your neighbor, your family member/friend, a stranger who encounters your art for the first time, a random person on social media, and the list goes on.

16. Do other cultures influence your artworks, if so, what are they and what about them do you find interesting?

Yes, many cultures influence my art. I would say the African and Brazilian style of art has impacted me significantly. I use a lot of vibrant colors and intricacies in my artwork which has a lot of similarities to both styles. African art is known for its bold use of color and patterns and its ability to convey complex cultural and spiritual meanings.

Brazilian art is also known for its vibrant use of color, along with a strong sense of movement and rhythm within their works.

17. Have you traveled outside of Jamaica before? If so, has this experience inspired or changed your perspective in any way?

Yes, I have traveled outside Jamaica and it has revealed how vast and diverse the world really is. The upbringings and cultural backgrounds of people literally impact their entire outlook on life, how carry themselves, how they operate, how they think and solve issues, and so much more including how they express themselves artistically.

18. What are you currently doing in the creative field?

I am an art director specializing in digital art/illustration mainly and graphic design secondary.

19. What do you see yourself doing in the future?

I have always been an entrepreneurial type of person and I currently own a business in which I provide artwork and visual designs for brands and businesses. In the near

future, I still see myself continuing and expanding my business internationally, while also providing for my wife and children/family.

20. What kind of advice do you have for individuals like me, who will be leaving High school soon?

My advice would be to simply stay focused. Always remember focus is more important than intelligence because although one could be the best at something, with no focus, they are no better than the one who is the worst. So find something you're passionate about, envision your goals, and focus on achieving them no matter what distractions or speed bumps may arise.

21. What puts you in your comfort zone, when you are making art?

I have a great passion for art and a natural self-driven characteristic, and they both always keep me eager and ready to create art. However, having peace of mind, and good calm music helps to get my mind geared up for the creative process as well.

22. What do you do before, during, or after your artwork creation process?

To prepare for the creation process, I first have to find the concept of what I'm aiming to create. Usually, I already know what I'm going to create due to my imagination and sometimes I'm inspired by stories, music, life events/history, etc.

Recently, I've started to use artificial intelligence (AI) technology such as ChatGPT to help gather information for my concepts a lot quicker. Then, I simply execute the creation process based on the concept and produce the artwork. Lastly, I distribute the artwork on my website and social media to promote or sell as poster prints to my audience, or if it's for a special commission, I would distribute it to the client.

- 1. What are your interests? My interests involve fine arts, videogames, books (comics, noir, history, romance, action adventure) chess, mythology and research into different cultures and animation.
- 2. Why did you decide to do Visual Arts? My interest in pursuing Visual arts was born from my desire to explore what I was capable of outside of the traditional fields of work. I never saw myself as a person who would sit behind a desk in an office space. I was always a more expressive and creative person so naturally I was more inclined to explore that side of me.
- 3. When do you create artworks? I tend to create artworks whenever I'm commissioned by people to design something. Whether it be murals, portraits, illustrations or signs. Outside of this I tend to create my own artworks whenever I have free time. These are usually made with the intention of selling as well as to challenge my thought process and technical skills.
- 4. What type of art style influences your artworks? (art Movements / art periods) I don't necessarily use art styles nor is my art really influenced by art movements. My work is usually influenced by my interests in life.
- 5. What type of artistic techniques or approaches do you take towards your artwork? As a trained artist, I specialize in hand drawn illustration, photography, printmaking and murals. I normally approach my artworks by sitting down and deliberating on what I want to do. Research is done on whatever concept I want and I'll use references from different cultures/ mythologies if necessary. Most times I'll use pictures of people or the environment that I take in conceptualizing my work.
- 6. What materials or tools in painting do you use mostly? (if the question applies to the artist) When it comes to painting if 8m doing a watercolor painting, I use watercolor paints, watercolor paper and fine detailing brushes. If I'm doing outside wall murals, I use acrylic based paints, painters and artist brushes. I may use ladders, painters tape, levels and rollers where necessary.
- 7. What kind of Graphic design or painting tools do you use in art? I use Adobe programs and artist paint brushes in my work.
- 8. What programmes do you use to aid you in your creative process? I usually use Adobe software programs in my art process when it comes to editing images and videos of my work. Whether it be the quality, lighting and colour.

- 9 Who are the various Visual artists that have influenced your artworks thus far? Artists who influence my work are Franklin Booth (painter with a pen), Laura Boswell, Taro Takizawa, Jed Henry, Sam Spratt, Kerby Rosanes and Bryce Kho.
- 10. What other avenues influence your artistic concepts? (Politics, Dance, Religion, Music, Love, Death, Family...) History and Mythology influence my concepts.
- 11. Which other individuals inspire you? Don't have any other individuals inspiring me.
- 12. In what condition, emotional state and place are you more creative, if there is a certain mood for your source of creativity? It is easier for me to create in an open environment devoid of noise and distraction, afternoon to early mornings in properly lit rooms work as well. I am capable of working under strenuous environments and I don't necessarily need to be in any emotional state to be creative.
- 13. Where have your artworks been presented? My works have been presented at the JCDC Art Competition and Exhibition and at the UWI Regional Headquarters. My murals have been presented at Water Lane in the Downtown Kingston area.
- 14. What are your artistic achievements? In terms of artistic achievements I exhibited my works as a part of my final year project at the Edna Manley School of the Visual and Performing Arts where I also earned my Bachelors in Fine Arts. I have exhibited at JCDC Art and Poetry Competitions, completed at least one art Residency in Jamaica and I have been apart of one major exhibit which was a Printmaking Exhibition held at the UWI Regional headquarters. Also I have a few murals that I have done under the Kingston Creative Paint the City Projects.
- 15. Which Visual artist(s), business or person have you networked with? (within the art society or outside of the artistic society? I have only networked with the Kingston Creative Group.
- 16. Do other cultures influence your artworks, if so, what are they and what about them do you find interesting? other cultures such as Japanese culture influence my work. With the Japanese I'm intrigued by how they preserve and pass down their culture through generations, whether good or bad. I like how they are able to reinvent and create different forms of media with said culture into art, books, games, interesting characters, movies and animation. I also enjoy how they take civic pride in themselves and don't try to change their culture to fit societal norms.

- 17. Have you traveled outside of Jamaica before? If so, has this experience inspired or changed your perspective in any way? Yes I have been to multiple countries in both hemispheres. My perspective on how people treat each other overseas versus here has changed. In terms of culture and art no it hasn't.
- 18. What are you currently doing in the creative field? I am currently doing mural and art design at the moment.
- 19. What do you see yourself doing in the future? More of the same, more murals, illustrations, creating prints. I may branch out and do other aspects of art like books and three dimensional art.
- 20. What kind of advice do you have for individuals like me, who will be leaving High school soon? Take your time to find yourself. Make sure the direction you want to take in life is fruitful and impactful to make yourself financially stable but also not burned out but be fulfilled. Make sure whatever it is, it is something that you enjoy, if you have to go to college to make your dreams come through, then go and focus on the task at hand. If not, then focus on getting a skill and learning about what you want to do and start your journey. Never be in a rush to try to get where you are. Things take time.

DESCRIPTION

The artwork Blossom of love is made up of lines, organic shapes and tossed patterns. The design is an A-Symmetrically balanced design that has a contrast of a female and a male subject of both sides of the work. Even though I would say that the rose in the middle is being emphasized on, some may beg to differ, because the colour of the design is in one flat unified colour. The warm red colour was selected, because of my theme "Love". This work has a lot of curving lines, which are to show texture and movement of the hair stands. The Blossom of love created, can be classified as an expressionist print.

Unlike a traditional background scene, the printmaking backdrop consists of a combination of lines and colors. The central focus of the artwork is the woman herself, who exudes an air of elegance with an accessory adorning and her neck. Upon my initial observation, I noticed that the woman's facial features lack proportionality and are depicted solely through lines, devoid of curves. The predominant colours employed in this artwork encompass red. Overall, the print conveys a sense of happiness, evoking a mood and visual effect that resonate with these emotions.

ANALYSIS

The design is made up mostly curved lines, because straight lines would mean that the work lacked emotion. The two persons in the print mirrored each other in the original design. At the start of the work, I wanted to focus on silhouettes only, but I realized that my artwork was too simple. So, with advice from others and my teacher. I thought of making stencils to put at the background of the wood block print. But, then, I had to change that idea, because I was told that stencil prints were not accepted. So, I worked on the design again and again. As I carved into the wood with the chisel, I used oil paint to print and thinner to clean my block/ matrix, tools, and surface that I was printing on. The board was carved and sanded over and over each time I wanted to fix the design and make another print. The materials that I printed on were regular cartridge paper and coated Bristol paper. Each print came out different, because of the amount of pressure that I applied to the block and the paper when I was using the big rolling pin.

INTERPRETATION

I believe that the idea of "love" is like a plant or a flower growing and blossoming. Love for some people grows slowly, when you are in the same space or place as the plant, sometimes you don't really see the grows. While in other cases, love grows quickly. A blossomed flower or rose is used as a symbol of telling another person that you care about them. The eyes of both persons are closed, this means they are not able to see who is in front of them despite being so close. They know that someone is standing right in front of them, but they cannot see the other individual or the fact that the love is blossoming. In another case, we can also say that love is blind, which is why they are unable to see. There is a cross at the side of the female's neck. A cross is often used to symbolize christianity and the faith of Jesus Christ. The symbol is carved out into her skin, the meaning of this could be that the religious or belief of christ in embedded within her skin. Christianity being a part of her, could be one of the reasons why, this so called love is blossoming.

The mentioned colour which is red, can indeed evoke different emotions and impressions. Purple is often associated with happiness. The use of lines in the printmaking can suggest strong emotions or emphasize the woman's physical features. The inclusion of curves for her hair added a contrasting softness to the overall composition. The woman's eye lids are facing downwards, indicating that probably she is crying and reflecting the overall mood of suffering. This interpretation aligns with your observation of the painting. It's important to note that without specific information about the painting or its title, it's difficult to provide a definitive analysis. Artistic interpretations can vary, and different viewers may perceive and interpret artworks differently based on their own experiences and perspectives.

JUDGEMENT

I think that my artwork is really good, not because I spent a long time working on it, but because I tried my best to work within the size restriction and reference examples of the elements and principles of art. The lines that I carved out are really neat, and my prints came out clean without any smudge and finger prints.

The catch a grenade for you can be classified as another expressionist print. I believe that I added other art styles to the work too, these include: symbolism and surrealism. Unlike a traditional background scene, the printmaking backdrop consists of a combination of wavy lines and colours. These wavy background lines are showing flames of fire. The central focus of the artwork is the woman and a man. The woman's facial features are depicted solely through lines and curved shapes. The predominant colors employed in this artwork encompass red. The composition of the artwork is A-symmetrically balanced, with opposite genders on either side.

There is a contrast between the red versus the white, the heart versus the grenade, organic shape and forms versus geometric shapes and forms. The wavy lines give the illusion of movement throughout the background of the design. Having the background look crowded, shows a compact space that is isolated. The people look trapped in the flames. I was advised to cut the matrix, so the print did not seem too crowded. The cut rubber added an interesting shape to the print and it made the negative versus positive spaces seem more interesting.

ANALYSIS

Most of my prints that I made for this design at first were all simple prints with not much detail. As the weeks progressed, I had to reprint and redraw my designs over and over again. At first I drew my design on an old piece of rubber. Due to the rubber getting cracked because it was old, I tried to use the cracks on the matrix as a part of my print. The interpretation you provided of the colors, lines, and emotions conveyed in the painting seems reasonable based on the description you provided. The colors you mentioned, such as red can indeed evoke different emotions and impressions.

Red is often associated with happiness, danger and love. The use of lines in the printmaking can suggest strong emotions or emphasize the woman's physical features. The inclusion of curves for her hair could add a contrasting softness to the overall composition. Indicating that she embraces the mood of happiness with the reflection love. It is important to note that without specific information about the Print, its title, we are able to see what the work is showing. During the starting process of this work, I was not able to get the details carved out to show this clearly. But, after weeks of carving into the rubber and starting over, the drawing and the print is strongly representing the theme "Love". Artistic interpretations can vary, and different viewers may perceive and interpret artworks differently based on their own experiences and perspectives.

INTERPRETATION

I wanted the audience to feel happiness, but then again question that same happiness that the feel when they look at the artwork and its title. On the left side of the print, it is providing statement that explains how all women feel and the agony that they are consistently in love with. The audience can see that the woman has given up everything in order to be with her lover. I have expressed the behaviour of woman in my artworks several times. Even though there are moments of silence and contentment. The emotions of the people portrayed in my work tend to show similar or totally different emotions at times. These may include: happiness, agony, frustration versus sadness, life versus death, future versus the past, and love versus war.

On the right side of the artwork, we are able to see that the grenade is merging with the heart on the left. This artwork could mean that both persons love each other that much that they would fight for each other or go in harms way for each other. Meanwhile, they work could be saying that the man prefers war and aggression over love. There are times when the love of a female is often frowned up on, hence the furious flames. I wanted to express my appreciation that I have for her through this print, because I want the audience to understand her.

JUDGEMENT

The printmaking relates to the entire female and male community. This community can understand the print and know what I was trying to portray. Every woman and male is able understand and comprehend the message behind this print, as we all feel the same way at one point in our lives. I believe that this is a strong value in the artwork. The weak value lies not having different colours. But, despite wanting to have this, the work shows how much days of efforts and labour that went into it. The simplicity in the shape of the people allows the viewers eyes to rest and not be too busy trying the search through the work. The lines were carved deep enough unlike my previous matrices and the design was printed neatly.

DESCRIPTION

The artwork has a variety of thick and thin lines. There are regular patterns of triangular shapes to the right of the matrix. Within the geometric shapes are a four irregular shapes representing the spine of the character being emphasised in the foreground. The thin lines were used to carve out the detail of the skeletal structure, meanwhile think lines and shapes were used to emphasize the background, eyes, teeth and silhouettes. There is a nice clean contrast between the negative and positive spaces carved out from the rubber. The progressive shapes are used to carved out the design for the teeth. The negative space underneath the bridge shows an empty section where the bruised heart walk out of.

The straight lines behind the bandaged heart of wrapped rectangles represents the heart moving away from that empty space under the bridge. Above the bridge, we can see the irregular shaped silhouettes of a male and a female. The male is kneeling, while the female's back is turned as if she is fed up. Within the foreground of the image, the emphasized skeleton has a cracked skull, and these same cracks make the shape of a heart.

ANALYSIS

Working with silhouettes and surrealistic characters who are expressing their emotions are the foundation of all of my work. Depicting inanimate objects without exaggerated feeling leaves me work looking boring and incomprehensible. Hence, the reason why I chose the theme of Love. Love is the death of me, is showing where a male sacrifices himself to be with the one he truly loves. This piece shows that love is painful. Overwhelming and sometimes worth the need to sacrifice your self to please the one you love. This can be classified as an expressionist printmaking.

The background of the scene consists of a combination of thick lines and a flat simplified colour. The central focus of the artwork has a skeletal structure that is the remains of a person. Upon my initial observation, I noticed that the man's facial features is A-symmetrically balanced and are depicted solely through lines, and curves. The predominant colour employed in this artwork encompass red. The overwhelming mood and visual effects evokes pain, disappointment, apologetic, betrayal and regret. The background of the two silhouettes highlight these emotions, meanwhile the foreground and the mi-ground is emphasizing on death, bruised hearts, stabs in the heart and an imprint that the hurt heart left on the skull or the skeleton.

INTERPRETATION

My personal belief of this work is the fact that "love" can kill, cause death, and cause hurt. No matter what a person does, whether they had good intentions or bad, it eventually can cause a person to die, emotionally or literally. The hearts on the skeleton that are dripping blood, shows that love or the heart itself can drain a person to their own demise. The cracked heart it the skull shows that love leaves a mark on every person wherever it goes. The bruised heart that is bandaged up is walking away from a space where it has experienced hurt repeatedly, and it is ready to heal and move on. The two silhouettes in the background is showing that the female has turned her back on every kneeling and begging apology, because she does not want to experience disappointment.

JUDGEMENT

I believe that this artwork is my best piece, despite trying to design the matrix in hot glue and other silicone at first, then ending up being disappointed in the results of the print. I believe the carving from the flat rubber gave my design life and visual aesthetics. The prints were neatly done, and the solid background gave it a nice finish.

DESCRIPTION

The Foreground of the artwork has a large character dressed in a suit, tearing his skin oof his face. The negative space on the man's outfit is used to represent the collars of the shirt and the jacket. The overlapped suit has two visible buttons in the center of the shirt. The man is wearing a ring on one of his hands. The Thin slightly curved lines are used to represent the details within the print. The mid-ground of the print has a female carved in simple organic shapes, showing a heart that she ripped from her chest. The heart is not pumping blood and below her breast where the hallow space is not bleeding. The background of the artwork had a small plant turning into a tree shaped heart with flames on either side of it.

ANALYSIS

The artwork was carved from a flat sheet of rubber. A surrealism and symbolism approach was taken to make this artwork. The carved design focused on mainly lines and very few shapes. The reference for the man was taken from a clip art found on the internet. Because I ddi not want to use the same design, I modified and appropriated it, so I could add my own meaning and setting for the work

INTERPRETATION

I want audience to see that the man who is representing me was suffering when I created this work. My expression of saddened behaviour is expressed through my works several times. I wanted the audience to see my pain of hurt, frustration and disappointment. On the other hand others could say that they would frown upon the male character who is me; because despite the female taking out her heart and giving it to me, I am rejecting it because I am frustrated and going crazy. There is not blood pumping from her heart nor draining from insides, which could mean that she has already been drained and dried up, or she never had any feeling and blood connection to the man. It could also mean that the man cheated, because there is a ring on his finger, but not on the female.

JUDGEMENT

I think that my work could have been better. But, the design that I carved out printed fairly good. I think the composition of the foreground, mid-ground, and background is organized properly and the proportions between each character is visibly accurate according to the distance between each.



DESCRIBE

The Gift Card ANNIVERSARY, can be classified as an expression of love through graphic design. The flowers coming over consists of a combination of irregular lines, organic shapes and a combination of bright popping colours contrasted with soft cool colours. The central focus of the artwork is the couple together embracing love. The facial features of the man and the woman are showing subtle emotions and a very interpersonal embrace. The proportions of the man is very muscular and filled with rough lines, The darker tone of the purple in comparison to the sky-blue colour of the female, presents the appearance of a softer and less muscular appearance. The details of both characters are made of of lines and very few light and dark tones. The background has a pale pink colour which makes the dark mid-ground of the characters show better. The foreground on the other hand shows a lot of shocking yellow and green that created a framed look around the man and the woman in the middle.

The man is wearing a white merino and the female is wearing a red, green and yellow merino. The left hand of the female is wrapped around the neck of the man, as he put both of is arms around her waist and the right arm, his hands are resting on her belly. Below her belly the red, green and yellow merino is slightly raised, allowing the viewer to see her tummy. Then we are able to see that she is wearing a green shorts with strings hanging. The whole artwork used mainly lines, colours and very few shapes. In doing so, We can see that the some of the design is showing repeated pattens, lines and mirrored patterns. This artwork referenced the Art Nouveau and pop art style.

ANALYSIS

The soft cloudy colours, give the work a subtle and soft look. In comparison with my printmaking artworks I could not get these nice colours, so my prints versus my graphic design pieces are showing opposite emotions based on the theme love. As mentioned before, colours evoke emotion. The blue indeed evoke different emotions and impressions. Blue is often associated with happiness and love and shows a pure loving relationship. The hair of the two people are dark, thus showing the look of the people being coloured or mixed. When drawing in photoshop, I am not really good at getting the details of the hair, so what I did was to use a darker shad, then get a bright colour and use lines to add texture to the hair. Using the smudge tool results in photoshop freezing and sometimes it does not turn out how I want it, so I mostly used it for the skin of the two people. Flat colours were used to design most of the work. A colour pallet was downloaded from google and I used the teardrop tool to select the colours that would match with the whole artwork.

INTERPRETATION

I wanted the audience to look at the anniversary card and feel nostalgic. I did not want to use the typical colours of red and white for the theme, but to add my personal touch and overall connection that people can relate to. The Anniversary card had a non traditional appearance. Even though I used a hallmark card as my reference, my work looks nothing like it. The picture that I referenced was showing a couple together just standing. I wanted to add to playful colours that represents a park scenery but, I could not think of a way to do that so creating a border of flowers in happy and bright colours was my last option. Though the two people are not expressing any smiles or showing teeth to say that they are happy, the mere fact that they are embracing each other and gazing gracefully says everything about the fact that they love each other. Yellow tends to represent sunshine, positive feelings, joy and happiness. Green represents nature, growth, good health, rebirth and other positive things happening throughout life.

When we are giving a gift to someone, t what you are giving usually mean something to you or the person that you are giving it to. While red roses mean passion, yellow roses represent friendship, caring and a happy bond between people. The happy anniversary gift card would mean that these two coloured people are celebrating the fact that two best friends got married to each other.

JUDGE

At first I thought that my flowers were not drawn properly and had too much green lines. But, I realized that the green complimented the yellow. The blue complimented the purple and the background is not one plain white section but a light colour that contrasts withe the whole design. Though my drawing of the two characters does not look like the original image, I think that I did a good job with the composition of the work.



DESCRIBE

The artwork is filled with light cloudy colours and tones. The background of the drawing had monumentally mountains, scaled, and were drawn to show the perspective between the skeletal person in the foreground. The foreground is made up of mostly lines and colours. By doing this, we are able to see the texture of the grass. The white and grey clouds give of a puffy look. The mountains in the background are not showing any textured details, just shows and faded tones on the smooth colours because the details can not be seen from a far.

ANALYZE

When I just started graphic design, this was my first artwork that I made on the drawing tablet. I asked my teacher to pose as if she was reaching for something. The photographs that were taken were used as my references. At first I found the details too much to draw on the tablet, because I was new to digital drawing in that sense. I decided to make the drawing simple and use the outline of the picture to do the drawing. Afterwards, the work turned into a silhouette design. I have to habit of drawing skulls, so the skull and the flowers were drawn long after the background with the mountains were drawn. I smudged out most of the colours and lines for the mountain.

INTERPRETATION

The artwork, as stated in the biography, is a storybook cover designed based on a fictional storyline. The grass growing into the skeleton, forming a part of its body, represents love and growth. Even when we are lost in the wilderness of nature, we can still search and reach out to love. Reaching out in the air allows us to touch the hearts of others.

JUDGEMENT

The blue and the different shades of pink created a nice contrast in the design. Both warm and cool colour schemes of blue and pink were used. I believe that the grass and the flowers helped to hide the fact that i am not good at drawing the feet and the hands really well. With that being said I think the colour scheme and the composition of the book cover created a nice design.



DESCRIBE

The artwork referenced the Pop Art style and surrealism. The artwork has a warm coloured brick wall of orange and red. The brick wall has on the om symbol, that speaks to the sound of the universe and that of god. The om symbol is used to represent the vibration of the universe. The background has rectangular shapes within a symmetrically balanced rigid shape. The mid-ground is showing a grey tone wall, and the foreground of the artwork is made up of lines and colours. On the right side of the poster we can see pink irregular shapes and white lines, meanwhile the top and the left side of the poster has light blue rectangular shapes.

ANALYZE

The design for the brick was designed first with the idea of a candle in mind at first. Then afterwards, I had intended on having the brick wall within the shape by itself printed on a shirt. I changed the idea of having this, because having a brick wall with a transparent background was thought to be too simple and boring and never reflected the theme of love. The idea of designing the poster was an after thought. In order to have all of my works tied in with each other, I used colours that we close to my other digital drawings in photoshop. Two pictures were referenced from the internet and appropriated into the pop art style. The Comic San MS font style in photoshop was used to add the text to the poster and then smooth edged paint brush opacity was reduced and used to paint faded white and light blue colours for the background.

INTERPRETATION




JUDGEMENT

Pictures from other tarot cards were referenced and I appropriated the artworks and redrew them in my ow style based on the theme love. The work was drawn on paper then I redrew them in photoshop. The art style referenced the art nouveau colour scheme and the drawn style of pop art.

INTERPRETATION

The artwork is about reading a person based on their date of birth, personality and luck. The designs are appropriated designs of other tarot cards that I referenced. I believe that the moon drawing with the hand kerchief around its head is really relatable to the Jamaican setting. I believe that girls are attracted to gangster guys that are cold, which is why the kerchief is around the male moon's head.

JUDGE

I don't think my artworks were done properly even though the few drawings that I did looks okay to me, because the entire deck of tarot cards were not drawn and I did not get to put enough things based on the Jamaican identity in it.
